REPORT:

Con Fire requested assistance from Contra Costa County Hazmat after receiving a significant amount of odor complaints from people living along the highways 80 and 4. The first complaints came in from El Sorbante and then traveled north and along to Martinez. County HazMat team members attempted to locate the source of the odors for a number of hours. County hazmat team members noted odors throughout the impacted area but were unable to locate a source.

County Hazmat members monitored throughout the community without observing odors of varying intensity but no significant or lasting impacts. County hazmat members monitored the perimeter and publically accessible areas of the P66 refinery and found no odors or detections. Teams investigated the Carbon plant with no detections or issues. Teams attempted to evaluate pipeline areas in the impacted areas for a release and uncovered nothing. County hazmat teams investigated the Ozol railyard in martinez to see if any hazmat railcars were reported as leaking, Ozol staff members reported that none of the traffic recently had been emanating odors and they inspected all current trains in the yard and found no leaks or detections.

County hazmat members were unable to pin down a specific source for the odors impacting the residents of west and central county. The team suspects that a mobile source was likely moving north on Highway 80 and then east on Highway 4 but there was now way to tell what was generating the odor, where it started or where it was going.

County Hazmat advised dispatchers to instruct affected individuals to shelter in place if the odors became an issue for their home and then ventilate when the threat had passed.
